

The institute now known as Government Rehabilitation Institute for Intellectual Disabilities (GRIID) grew over time and has been contributing to society in various avatars. It started it's journey as Government Institute for Mentally Retarded Children (GIMRC), then it grew to Regional Institute for Mentally Handicapped (RIMH), and now as GRIID. It is an outcome of visionary Professor Bir Singh Chavan. He took up the challenge of running this institute under department of Psychiatry, Government Medical College and Hospital. He was extremely passionate about the institute and the cause of intellectual disabilities. Students have undertaken accessibility audit of the whole Chandigarh city with NSS volunteers. GRIID is also publishing the Journal of Disability Management and Rehabilitation for many years.

Future plans for GRIID include expanding the school with more vocational sections and increasing enrollment of persons with intellectual disability under sheltered workshop. In college there is a plan to start diploma in early intervention. Construction of Sensory Garden is under process. I sincerely hope that the University for disability studies becomes a reality soon.

All the staff of GRIID is committed, diligent, and hard working. Any institute needs hard work and perseverance of all the staff to be built and brought to the level where it is known at national level. Bringing out this souvenir on the occasion of Silver Jubilee has given us all a chance to revisit our journey and feel proud of the achievements. Real joy is when the disabled students achieve success at national and international level in sports, yoga and cultural events. It has been very satisfying endeavor for all the staff.



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

### **SCHOOL**



Government Rehabilitation Institute for Intellectual Disabilities in Sec-31, Chandigarh, stands as a testament to the enduring commitment of society towards providing compassionate care support and empowerment to individuals with a noble vision. GRIID has traversed a remarkable journey over the years.

Special education plays a crucial role in the development of persons with intellectual disability (PwID). At GRIID school, comprehensive training is imparted by Special Educators and Vocational Instructors to PwID in order to develop their personal, social, academic and vocational skills. GRIID has been putting immense efforts to provide them a platform by opening different avenues in academics, yoga, dance, music and sports. This enables children to manage themselves, and thus lead a better life.

In December, 1998, the administrative charge of the Institute was handed over to Government Medical College & Hospital, Sector – 32, Chandigarh. At that point of time the school was running in Government Institute for Mentally Retarded Children (GIMRC) with 30 students, 4 Special Educators and one Yoga Teacher.

There were two primary sections, one care group and only two vocational sections – Candle making and chairrecaning. Also, there was a residential facility for students.

Later, in the year 2009, the Regional Institute for Mentally Handicapped (RIMH) came into being. It was inaugurated by General SF Rodrigues, Governor of Punjab and Administrator of UT, Chandigarh. The school was now housed in this building. In the year 2015, RIMH was then renamed as Government Rehbilitation Institute for Intellectual Disabilities (GRIID).

GRIID was established in view of the Right of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 aiming at giving them what is rightfully theirs, in the field of Education, Social Security, health, Rehabilitation and Recreation.

- At present there are 450+ students, 24 classes, 11 vocational sections, 46 teachers and Instructors.
- Hostel facilities are available in GRIID for school students.
- National Institute of Open School (NIOS) has granted accreditation to GRIID as a Special Accredited Institution for the Education of Divyangjan (SAIED) Centre for (10th) Secondary Course from the academic session 2020-21. Till now 26 students of GRIID school have passed the 10th class.
- There are 6 Sheltered workshops namely Cutting & Tailoring, Masala Grinding, Paper Bag Making, Sanitary Pad Making, Jewellery Making & Sublimation Printing (T-shirts & Mugs).

- Participation of students in various co-curricular activities of yoga, music, dance and sports at national and international levels was encouraged and students received accolades. Five students brought Gold, Silver & Bronze medal for our country in Special Olympics and Paralympics events at Alaska (USA), Tokyo and Bangkok. 02 students were awarded commendation certificate on Republic day by the Chandigarh Administration for their winning silver and gold medals in Unified Badminton Championship in Thailand.
- National level 255 athletes participated in various sports events and won Gold, Silver & Bronze medals.
- Students participated in Walk with a Difference (WWAD) at Kolkata and won titles of 'Star Icon' and 'Self Confidence.'
- 73 students have been sent in inclusive education from GRIID.
- 80 students have been given job placement at various places in Chandigarh.

All the staff of GRIID is working for the betterment of special children with compassion, zeal, enthusiasm and commitment.

### CHILD DEVELOPMENT CLINIC



The Clinic of GRIID was established with the aim of providing medical and rehabilitative facilities to children with Intellectual Disability, Autism, Cerebral Palsy and Multiple Disabilities, i.e, the disabilities which are covered under the National Trust Act (1999). Initially, occupational therapy section was started in September 2000, followed by speech therapy and physiotherapy sections were established for providing therapy services to school students and OPD patients as well.

In the year 2002, Early Intervention Program (EIP) was started for children (<6 years) with developmental delay, in which integrated assessment and management was started. Gradually the clinic expanded with addition of Paediatrician, Psychologist, Special education and IT section. Further, various programs and special clinic were initiated like Mother and child clinic, Autism clinic, Epilepsy clinic and school health program. The clinic was then named as Child Development Clinic (CDC). Since its inception, clinic team have been organising various assessment and awareness camps in different places of tricity and nearby states Haryana/Punjab/Himachal Pradesh.

Today, the Child development Clinic at GRIID is well established and provides clinical services, disability certification, early interventions, vision and hearing assessment, therapies viz. speech, occupational, sensory integration, physiotherapy, behavioral therapy: for all children coming to OPD and GRIID School. Besides these, CDC makes assessment for various school children as required by Sarv Shiksha Abhiyan. CDC has also developed community outreach programs which was started initially in the HRD section and was then shifted to clinic in year 2000. Under this program door to door survey of villages is being done in a structured manner to identify persons with intellectual disability, facilitate their certification and provide guidance regarding schemes of National Trust. Many academic and research activities are done also done in the clinic as well as community level.

#### Services provided at the clinic are:

- Diagnosis, management and follow up of people with above mentioned disabilities in OPD (>6years) by pediatrician.
- Early intervention program (<6 years age): An integrated assessment and management program by multidisciplinary team of clinic which includes child specialist, psychologist and therapists.
- IQ and Autism assessment along with disability certification and UDID for all patients: By disability board constituting Joint Director GRIID, child specialist, psychologist and special educator.
- Intervention therapies: Speech therapy, Occupational therapy, Sensory integration therapy, Physiotherapy, Behavioral therapy: for all children coming to OPD and GRIID School.
- Vision and hearing assessment.
- Provision of free medicines to OPD and GRIID school children by staff nurse as per prescription. During Lockdown the school children were being provided medicines at their doorstep in order to avoid any inconvenience to the parents.



- Special education to OPD children and their preparation for school admission.
- Awareness and Facilitation of various schemes under NTA act like Railway concession certification, Niramaya health insurance and guardianship certification.
- Community outreach program:. The objective of this program is to reach the underprivileged patients who cannot visit GRIID for various reasons. Till now, we have helped more than 600 patients and linked them with GRIID.
- Tele counseling facility; for outstation patients which was very useful during Covid pandemic also.
- Camps for IQ and Autism assessment: we organize various camps for assessment and disability certification in schools and in different community of the city as well as many nearby rural areas. Till date 75 camps have been organized.
- Assessment and facilitation of UDID for various disabilities in community via house to house surveys and camps in coordination with state resource centre.
- Special clinics are run for Down's syndrome, Epilepsy, Autism spectrum, School health and Psychiatry OPD on different days of week.
- We celebrate various commemorative Days like Down Syndrome Day (21st march), Autism Awareness Day (2nd April) and International Day of Persons with Disabilities (3rd December). Clinic and School staff plan various activities like camps, sports meet, cultural programs, fun games, drawing and painting competitions and many other recreational activities.
- Along with school we are running one to three months Internship programs for graduate and post graduate students of psychology, physiotherapy, speech therapy and occupational therapy.

### **COLLEGE**



Considering the acute shortage of trained manpower in the field of rehabilitation of persons with intellectual disability GRIID has started its Human Resource Development (HRD) wing during the year 2002 with the recognition of Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi. The first course of the college was Diploma course in Vocational Training and Employment (DVTE) with an intake of 15 seats. In the year 2009 D.Ed. Special Education (Intellectual Disability) course was introduced. Followed by that B.Ed. Special Education (Intellectual Disability) and M.Ed. Special Education (Intellectual Disability) programs were also started, which was also recognized by Rehabilitation Council of India, New Delhi and affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh in the year 2010 and 2013 respectively. At that time, it was one of the first institutes in northern India to run master's program in Special Education (Intellectual Disability). At present the number of seats in B.Ed. Special Education (Intellectual Disability) has increased from 25 to 33. Alumni of this college are working in different colleges, schools, and clinics in Govt. and Private Sectors across India. It includes the schools under Education Departments of Govt. of NCT of Delhi, Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, and Himachal Pradesh. In addition to it, many alumni have started their own clinical set ups and providing services to children with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

In addition to conducting this long term training programs the college is involved in various other activities and these are:

- 1. Projects in collaboration with Samagra Shiksha, Chandigarh.
- 2. Collaboration with various agencies like SCERT, NIPCCD In-service Teacher Training of teachers.
- 3. Community mentorship program
- 4. Organize awareness programs for parents, peers in school, and community members on various disability related matters like early identification, early intervention, Government Schemes and benefits.
- 5. National and International conferences and Workshops, Continuing Rehabilitation Education (CRE) Programs, Faculty Development Programs, and Seminars are organised on regular basis for the benefit of professionals working in the field.
- 6. Mentoring Program for the community by the trainees of college in the year-2018-19 for reaching.

#### Under National Service Scheme (NSS) following activities are held:

- 1. Audit of accessibility for all public places including Government offices, colleges, schools, parks, shopping malls, and other buildings conducted during 2019 and the report has been submitted to Chandigarh Administration.
- 2. Every year NSS wing organizes 7 days day/ night camps for its members
- 3. Observation of various National importance days
- 4. NSS members participated in Blood and stem cells donations camps
- . Successfully completed trekking camp by female students of college
- 6. Conducted various programs to create awareness regarding malnutrition, hygiene, importance of education, disability, needs of persons with disability etc.

### **LIBRARY**



- Institutional library was started in year 2000 in GIMRC building with few books, which now has been developed into a full-fledged library having huge and diverse collection.
- It is the most well stocked library in North India among Institutes for disability. We have 7,203 books related to various disabilities, their assessment, management & early intervention, special education & inclusion, rights & legal provisions.
- Also, it has yearly subscriptions of 10 academic journals (national and international) which are needed for carrying out research by college students, 9 magazines and 10 different newspapers.
- It has digital library on which many medical journals related to the field of disability are available, also, all the data are stored.

Aashreya is a permanent home for destitute/ orphaned children or adults with intellectual disability. It was inaugurated by his excellency Gen (Retd) S. F. Rodrigues, Administrator, UT, Chandigarh, on 3rd December, 2008. It is under the aegis of GRIID sector 31, CHD. Rightly said, great things come with great thoughts and the foundation of Aashreya was the vision of Late Dr. Bir Singh Chavan (former director GMCH-32 and GRIID). It is a situated in sector 47 of city beautiful and Currently, there are 31 residents with different abilities under the care of 'Aashreya'. There is an activity room, a mess and a dining hall and sufficient space for

outdoor games. Disability certification and pensions are provided to all the residents. This place with its residents and staff members is truly a 'Home'.






