#### **Diagnostic Camps**

In order to assess ID and SLD in November and December 2024, many camps were organised at different Govt. Schools in Chandigarh, in cooperation with the Department of Psychiatry, GMCH, and GRIID Clinic under Samagra Shiksha, Chandigarh. On 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2024, first camp was held at GMSSS, Sector-33D, Chandigarh. 04 IQ certificates were given, and 28 patients were assessed in this camp.



On 18th November, another camp was conducted at GMSSS-16, Chandigarh,

wherein 02 IQ certificates were given and 22 patients were assessed.



On 25<sup>th</sup> November, the next camp was held at GMHS-20D, Chandigarh, where 27 patients had their IQ assessed.



At GMSSS, Sector-40, Chandigarh camp was held on 23<sup>rd</sup> December. 27 patients were assessed for IQ and 4 were given certificates.

02 students with Intellectual Disability from GRIIID have been successfully employed at Hotel Taj, Chandigarh, and they commenced the duties from 5<sup>th</sup> December, 2024.
