
Report on Workshop on Teaching Learning Material and adaptive devices.

The session was divided into two parts: **demonstration and hands-on activity.**

For special educators and vocational instructors: 11:30 am to 1:00 pm





Demonstration Session:

- The resource person Ms. Paramjit Kaur showcased various simple teaching learning materials made from everyday objects such as cardboard, fabric, paper, waste plastic bottles, treads, ribbons etc.
- Participants were introduced to creative ways of using these materials to teach various concepts, including literacy, numeracy, and social and communication skills.

Hands-on Activity Session:

- Teachers were engaged in a hands-on activity, creating their own simple teaching learning materials using the demonstrated techniques and materials.
- The facilitators provided guidance and support, encouraging participants to think creatively and explore new ideas.







Outcomes:
